## **New York League of Conservation Voters Endorses Jonathan Kaiman For Supervisor**

NEW YORK --- The New York League of Conservation Voters, which works to make environmental sustainability a top political and policy priority in New York State, has announced its endorsement of Jonathan Kaiman for re-election as North Hempstead Town Supervisor.

Jonathan Kaiman is the Chairman of the North Hempstead Solid Waste Management Authority, as well as Commissioner of the Great Neck North Water Authority. He is on the board of the Long Island Regional Planning Council, and as Supervisor, authorized the Truck Biofuel and Recycled Caps program, instituted North Hempstead's annual Earth Day Program and Operation Clean Sweep, established a town-wide recycling program, and an annual "EcoFest" attended by thousands in the town's 12-acre botanical garden. Supervisor Kaiman made extreme leaps in green infrastructure, initiating conversion to hybrid, electric, and CNG fleet vehicles, as well as the construction of the Platinum LEED New Cassel Community Center. He worked on the consolidation of two sewage treatment plants located on Manhasset Bay into one modern plant and as well as the Prescription Drug Take-Back Program.

"With his breath of knowledge and experience in many fields, Jonathan Kaiman is more than qualified to lead us into the next decade" said Mitchell Pally, chair of NYLCV's Long Island Chapter. "That's why the New York League of Conservation Voters is proud to endorse Supervisor Jonathan Kaiman for re-election."
